Developing Fine Motor Skills

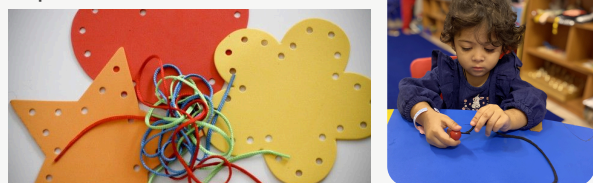
Clothespin Activity
